



Overall

Based on your score in your entry year, among the eight GILOs within yourself, your top 3 strengths are Effective Communication - Oral, Ethical Decision Making and Global Perspectives. 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GILO 1: Problem Solving Skills

Problem solving skills refer to the ability to deal with novel problems/tasks/situations, to plan with existing resources, to execute a plan and to monitor the process, and to reflect upon solution attempts.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 79.8% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 3.543.

You are able to understand a novel, ill-defined and complex problem, to select from multiple approaches, to use principles to determine appropriate ways to solve the problem and revise the plan when needed, and to judge the quality of outcomes and process against the criteria selected from established ones.

GILO 2: Critical Thinking Skills

Critical thinking skills refer to the ability to judge in a reflective way what to do or to believe in a given context. It is a process of purposeful, self-regulatory judgment, which reasons consideration to evidence, context, conceptualizations, methods, and criteria used. Critical thinking skills are used when reading media reports social political about controversial issues, such as whether new immigrants should be entitled of equal rights (e.g., for the 6,000 HKD financial returning).

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 36.4% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 2.964.

You are able to differentiate relevant from irrelevant information, to raise appropriate clarifying questions, and to be aware of the simple logical reasoning.

GILO 3: Creative Thinking Skills

Creative thinking skills refers to divergent thinking. People think divergently are able to think from multiple perspectives and create a large amount of original ideas. They also hold flexible and practical attitude towards the ideas they created. Creative persons are able to develop rough ideas into sophisticated ones by adding details.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 64.8% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 3.355.

You are able to produce lots of entirely new ideas and are willing to experiment potentially risky ideas that can be applied to specific purpose. You are comfortable with uncertainties with boundary breaking.

GILO 4(a): Oral Communication Skills

Oral communication skills refer to the skills adopted in oral communications to enhance the effectiveness of communication.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 88.4% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 4.202.

When communicating with others, you are able to understand others' thoughts, concerns, and feelings that underlie messages. You have sophisticated interactive skills, e.g. deliberately use interactive skills to create good interpersonal rapport. You can also produce highly person-centered messages that are tailored to the characteristics of the audience and situation.

GILO 4(b): Written Communication Skills

Written communication skills refer to the skills adopted in written communications to enhance its effectiveness.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 86.1% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 3.89.

You are able to organize materials coherently to suit the length, complexity and purpose of your written product, to spell, punctuate and use grammar accurately all the time, to use various supporting materials (e.g., examples, illustrations, statistics, analogies, quotations from relevant authorities) to make reference, and to select and use a format and style of writing that is appropriate to your purpose.

GILO 5: Social Interaction Skills

Social interaction skills refer to the skills used in social events to initiate and maintain good relationships with others while protect oneself appropriately.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 54.5% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 3.561.

You could initiate a relationship even though there is no clear benefit to either side. You are able to share with others about yourself given consideration of where, when, what and with whom to share, to stand up to fight for one's own right, and to alleviate others' distress. You deal with conflicts rather than passively avoid them.

GILO 6: Ethical Decision Making

Ethical decision making refers to the ethical consideration in decision making, to what extent ethical issues are considered during the decision making process.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 78.7% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 4.159.

You not only abide the law and maintain high level of moral integrity, but also exhibit the courage to inspire others and to promote moral conduct and high level of moral integrity.

GILO 7: Global Perspectives

Global perspectives refer to individual's awareness of the limitations of one's own culture and of other cultures, of the interdependence of countries, and the inter-connectiveness of past, present, and future.

Compare within Peers: Your performance is higher than 62.7% of the students in your Institution.

Score Interpretation: Your score is 4.091.
